Starting in Reception

- At Pennoweth our Early Years works hard to ensure that your child's Reception year is happy, active, fun, exciting and secure.
- In Reception your child will be following the EYFS curriculum (Development Matters) which has 17 learning areas. There are 3 prime areas and 4 specific areas.
- Prime Areas: Communication & Language, Physical Development and Personal Social and Emotional Development.
- The prime areas help your child to develop skills in the Specific Areas: Literacy, Maths, Understanding the World and Expressive Arts and Design.

How your child will learn

- These 7 areas are used to plan your child's learning and activities. and we make sure that the activities are suited to your child's unique needs.

- This is a little bit like a curriculum in primary and secondary schools, but it's suitable for very young children, and it's designed to be really flexible so that staff can follow your child's unique needs and interests.

- Children in the EYFS learn by playing and exploring, being active, and through creative and critical thinking which takes place both indoors and outside.

The Nursery side gate is open from 8.40am. Please bring your child round to their classroom and the door will be open at 8:40

A fruit snack and milk is provided free every day for your child to have for their morning snack.

All Reception children are eligible for a free school lunch. This can be a hot meal or a sandwich. Every day there is a fantastic salad bar which your child can choose from independently.

If your child would rather have a packed lunch, please send in a healthy lunch in a named lunch box.

All children should bring in a named water bottle. We do encourage the children to drink freely throughout the day.

Your child will be involved in various learning activities throughout the day both inside and outside the classroom.

Please send in a pair of named wellies to keep at school for their outdoor learning when they are likely to get wet and muddy. We do have waterproofs at school which the children can wear.

Also, please send in a change of clothes to be kept at school in case of any accidents.

Read, Write, Inc is the phonics programme that we use at Pennoweth.
