This week Keystage One children were treated to a morning with an artist. we invited a local artist, Claire

Stockings-Baker to run workshops with our Years 1 and 2 based around the 'Magic of Autumn' in our new Creative Lab. The Children were all fully engaged and had so much fun learning new printing techniques with her. They were very proud of their achievements and produced the most beautiful prints. I'm sure you will see them around school very soon!

Elsewhere around the school, our focus has been predominantly Geography based with classes learning about

different regions around the world from the Arctic and Antarctic through to the continents of North and South America.

Year Three and Four have spent time locating these Continents and understanding their geography, whilst also identifying major cities and Comparing populations sizes.

Within our Year Five and Six year groups, they have begun their learning on our 'Frozen Kingdoms' topic and researching key information about the regions. Pupils looked at the average precipitation and temperatures associated with these areas and produced wonderful posters and comparisons to our weather in the UK.

Finally this week, as a school we have been also focusing on Remembrance through our assemblies where Mrs

Augarde delivered some important information about its importance and why it takes place each year. Through these assemblies our pupils sat thoughtfully, reflected on their learning and asked questions of staff throughout the week when the topic was discussed in class. On Friday, we held a minutes silence in each class to commemorate Remembrance ahead of Sunday. This was well received by the pupils who treated this time with respect and

reflection. Well done #Team Pennoweth.

Looking forwards to next week, we have our annual Children In Need day taking place next Friday (17th November). Over the course of the day, we will be completing activities to celebrate this great Cause including a Bearpee' challenge and a design your own bandana which can be Pudsey themed.

Report from our Keystage One Gardening Club



Whoa, Storm Ciaran definitely left its mark in and around the school but particularly with our poor Polytunnel!

After discussing the storm, Gradening Club decided to see if there was any damage around the area.... and we were surprised to see that the lid had been blown off the compost bin!

Not only had it blown off, but it seems to have completely blown away! We are going to have to keep our eyes open around school for it and Mrs Mallaber has even said there may be some tribal points for the person who finds it.

Luckily, inside the tunnel we didn't find too much damage apart

from the hole in the side which has seemed to have gone grown

since last week.

It was then time to get on with the usual jobs done which included topping up the now 'lidless' compost bin with the tea bags from the staff room.

Next, we looked at some

potatoes that were now growing roots and we planted these in



the soil. We then put some compost in the bottom of each bag and then the potatoes. Once we finished this we then covered them with a little more compost.

Each week, we will check and add a little more compost to keep them hidden until the bags are full.

Finally, there was enough time to water the reamining plants that were dry, litter pick and then wash our hands ready for home.

Let's hope we don't have any more storms anytime soon! We're not sure the Polytunnel will survive!

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about Microtransactions (often abbreviated as "MTX") are digital purchases made within an app or game to unlock extra features or additional content such as new levels. A popular sub-set of these are loot boxes, which contain a selection (usually random) of virtual items: from character skins to game-changing equipment like better weapons. Microtransactions (and loot boxes in particular) are now widespread in apps and games, but concerns persist that they normalise gambling and

can foster addictive behaviours – especially among younger players.

At National Online Safety, we believe in empowering parents, carers and trusted adults with the information to hald an informed conversation about online safety with their children, should they feel It is needed.
