Hello and welcome back to another edition of the Pennoweth News.

Once again, we have been blessed with a number of different learning experiences and trips this week. We kick start our round off this week in Year One, where the children have been creating "Transient Art' in the style of Andy Goldsworthy. This required the children to collect and gather natural resources from around the school to create interesting pieces of art or sculptures. It was safe to say that the staff were incredibly proud of the pupils and that they really engaged well with the lesson.

Moving up into Years Three and Four, the Children were focusing on their Science and Geography skills this week, where they have been building their knowledge of North and South America and taking time to investigate key landmarks and iconic architecture found within America. Children were drawing and detailing monuments such as "The Whitehouse" and "The Statue of Liberty". Once again, the attention to detail and concentration shown by our pupils, allowed them to produce some fantastic pieces of learning.

Finally, within Year Five and Six, the Children have been honing their skills within Geography. This week the

children have been Comparing Polar regions and their oceans. The Children spent time Comparing temperatures, wildlife and identifying misconceptions about the regions.

We have also been lucky enough to celebrate Children In Need

today. It was amazing to see a sea of spots on the gates and across the school. It was fantastic to see such a fantastic Cause Celebrated and we would like to thank all of you for your kind donations. We raised a superb total of £159.50 which will be passed on to the

Charity.
