Nursery

This morning, the children had an incredible learning experience at Nursery. They celebrated the end of their topic, "How does that building stay up?" by engaging in a big build day.

They put into action all the skills and knowledge they've gained throughout this topic. Their task was to construct shelters to protect themselves from the Big Bad Dragon, who threatened to blow their dens down.

In three small teams, they collaborated to design and build their dens. They worked together to gather resources, solve problems, and ensure their shelters were sturdy and spacious enough for everyone.

The enthusiasm and Creativity they displayed while planning and implementing their ideas were truly remarkable and could be heard through their delighted squeals. After completing their dens, they joyfully visited each other's Creations, inventing neur games along the way

It's wonderful to witness their excitement and growth as they explore and learn. We're proud of their accomplishments and look forward to more enriching experiences ahead.

Reception

This week Reception celebrated Chinese New Year by making a vegetable stir fry. We made a list of ingredients that we wanted and went shopping at Grow Box greengrocers in Redruth. The children enjoyed seeing all the delicious fresh fruit and vegetables. Later we prepared and ate our food in the Creative Lab. We loved trying all of the different cooked vegetables that we chose but our favourite part was the noodles!

Keystage One

This week, the Year One and Two children had an exciting visit from the police. We learnt about the different jobs they have and even got to look at their hats and handcuffs! The best part was when we got to go in the police car and hear the sirens! In addition, the Year One children have enjoyed learning and performing a Brazilian song this week. Whilst in Year Two, the children have enjoyed learning about Chinese New Year and having a go at writing some Chinese Characters.

Keystage Two

Experience days have continued within Keystage Two. On Tuesday, the Year Three's and Four's spent time completing three workshops over the course of the day which followed and rounded off the children's learning around the stone, iron and bronze ages. Weaving sessions took place inside alongside some cave painting and figure drawing. A range of materials were used to create these designs including cloth and even plastic bags. The final workshop took place in our forest school where the children were challenged to create their very own round houses for our nomadic dolls. A range of materials and techniques were used to create the structures with a gallery style evaluation provided by the pupils to provide next steps and positive feedback.

Upper Keystage Two were also keen to get in on the experience days this week with a full day of history taking place around their history topic 'Peasants, Princes and Pestilence'. The children took time to complete a medieval dance routine, before Creating a huge timeline in the hall where they debated the positives and negatives of the era. Well done Team Pennoweth!
















Attendance


We aim for all our children to have at least 96% attendance throughout the year.

Online Safety Update

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about

onkey Cool, this platform aims to fill the gap left by Omegle (which has now shut down) by placing users in random video chats with strangers. Participants use their mobile number and ochat username to connect to the service, where they can make matches, message other people and join group chats. The mobile version has been removed from the App Store due to safety concerns, but iPhone owners can still access the site via their web browser. The app remains available on Google Play, where its listing claims that Monkey has more than 30 million users worldwide

DISCUSS THE DANGERS

Even if you're comfortable with your child using Monkey, it's still important to talk about the potential dangers. It's crucial, for instance, that young people recognise the risks that stem from video chatting with strangers; that they understand not to share identifying information (like their street or school name); and that they know what to do if they are exposed to inappropriate content.

RESTRICT IN-APP PURCHASING

If your child is accessing Monkey via an Android device, you can prevent them from making in-app purchases through the device's settings. If you do allow your child to use the site, we'd recommend that you enable this feature: young people have been known to spend significant amounts of money in their desire to unlock more features in apps such as this.

REPORT INAPPROPRIATE CONTENT

Monkey states in the safety section of its site that "people are given the power" and that, to a large extent, Monkey is "self-governing," If a user is exposed to sexually explicit or inappropriate content on the platform, they can select the 'police' emoji in the top right corner of their screen to submit a report for Monkey's moderation team to review.

SPOT THE SIGNS


If you're concerned that your child is spending too much time on Monkey – or that they may have been exposed to inappropriate or distressing content – it's important to watch for potential indications that they've been affected emotionally. They could be unusually irritable or unable to concentrate, for example, or failing to complete their homework or even to eat regular meals.





