#### DT & History Focus

- A prototype is a mock-up of a design that will look like the finished product but may not be full sized or made of the same materials
- Design features are the aspects of a product design that the designer would like to emphasise
- The Romans invented or developed many things that are still used today including many roads
- Underfloor heating as first developed by the Romans as a way of keeping their homes warm
- The Celts built roundhouses from wattle and daub with thatched roofs
- The Celts were known for being skilled craftsmen and made jewellery using glass
- Cooking techniques include baking, boiling, frying, grilling and roasting
- The Celts were tribespeople who lived in England and across most of Europe over 2000 years ago
- The Romans invaded Britain in AD43 under the order of Emperor Claudius

## Key Vocabulary

- ⇒ Ampitheatre: a place where Romans went to watch gladiator fights, animal fights and executions
- ⇒ Aqueduct: a system of pipes, canals, tunnels and bridges that carried water into towns
- ⇒ **Celts**: Tribespeople who lived in England over 2000 years ago
- ⇒ **Gladiator:** a slave who was trained to fight other people or wild animals for public entertainment
- ⇒ **Latin**: the ancient Roman language
- ⇒ **Mosaic:** a picture, decoration or pattern made by arranging small pieces of coloured glass, tile or stone
- ⇒ Roman Empire: the area of land that was taken over by the Roman army
- ⇒ **Romans**: a powerful civilisation that ruled most of modern Europe for hundreds of years

## Homework Projects

- Use a range of sources to create a timeline, showing the chronology of the Roman empire from 753BC to AD476
- With an adult, find a picture of a Roman soldier.
  Print the image then label their clothing and armour
- Use a range of historical source materials to find out how the Roman invasion transformed the lives of the Celtic Britons. Use the information gathered to write a short non-chronological report with the title 'How the Romans changed Britain'
- ♦ The Romans worshipped many different gods. Find out about these gods and write a short profile about each one: Jupiter, Diana, Pluto, Mars and Juno
- Put these people into a diagram to show the hierarchy of ancient Rome: emperor, slaves, plebeians, patricians, equites. Describe the roles each of these played in Roman society
