Geography and History Focus. Key Facts:

- Invisible lines of latitude run horizontally around the Earth and show the northerly or southerly position of a geographical area
- Invisible lines of longitude run vertically from the north to the south pole and show the westerly or easterly position of a geographical area
- The Northern Hemisphere is the part of the Earth that is to the north of the Equator
- The Prime Meridien is the imaginary line from the North Pole to the South Pole that passes through Greenwich in England and marks zero degrees longitude from which all other longitudes are measured
- The Chihuahuan is the largest desert in North America stretching all the way from south-west United States deep into the central Mexican highlands
- Mexico is located in the south of the continent of North America. Mexico City is the capital city. It is home to nearly nine million people. It has a diverse landscape including mountains, rainforests and deserts.
- The Maya were a group of indigenous people who lived in Mexico and other parts of Central America over 3000 years ago.

Key Vocabulary

- ⇒ Civilisation: a well organised and developed society
- ⇒ Desert: a waterless, desolate area of land with little or no vegetation, typically covered with sand
- ⇒ Maya Glyphs: the writing system of the Maya civilisation
- Ancient: coming from, or belonging to, a time that was long
- ⇒ Maya temple: a place of worship
- ⇒ Maya stelae: Tall stone monuments made by the Maya civilisation
- ⇒ Taco: a Mexican food that consists of a folded and usually fried piece of thin bread (called a tortilla) that is filled with meat, cheese and lettuce for example
- ⇒ Latitude: Invisible lines running horizontally around the Earth
- ⇒ Longitude: Invisible lines running vertically around the Earth
