Hello and welcome back to another edition of the Pennoweth News.

This week, we have hosted our annual 'Sustainability Week' where our children study a strand of our Trust Sustainability Curriculum to widen and broaden their awareness of the environment. The children have discussed measures that are currently being taken to sustain and improve our current environment situation. Across the school, there has been a flurry of activity, including litter picks, posters being designed and new technologies to support our planet and the best way to ensure its preserved for generations to come.

In other news, we have also been blown away by our amazing Year 1's and 4's who have also been completing their Phonics Screening and Multiplication Times Table checks respectively. Throughout the week, our children have shown fantastic determination, perseverance and an amazing attitude towards these challenges and been rewarded with some super results. Well done Year 1 & 4.

That being said, let's see what has been happening around the school in more detail!

#### **Nursery**

This week in Nursery, we have been taking part in the whole school sustainability project, focusing on the theme Life on Land. We began by reading The Last Wolf, which sparked lots of thoughtful conversations about the importance of trees and the different places animals live.

The children went on a nature walk around the school grounds to see what plants and animals they could find. They were very excited to discover some mysterious poop on the grass — which we later found out was from a hedgehog, after reading all about different animal droppings! We also heard lots of different birds singing in the trees and talked about why trees are such important homes for wildlife.

We set up a trail camera and were thrilled to spot a hedgehog out at night looking for food. This inspired the children to think of ways we can help look after wildlife in our local area. They suggested planting seeds from trees to grow new woodlands, taking care not to break branches, and keeping the school grounds clean and safe for animals.

The children have enjoyed planting seeds, designing safe spaces for animals, and creating a large collage tree in the classroom filled with pictures of animals who might live there. It's been a wonderful week of discovery, care, and learning about how we can protect and appreciate the natural world around us.

#### **Keystage One**

Year 1 have loved a break from the norm this week and had the opportunity to engage in our sustainability week. We have been learning about recyclable materials and how we can protect and care for our local environment. We have conducted a 'litter pick' of our school playground and fields and were amazed to see how much litter we could collect! We have also enjoyed building a sculpture of a marine animal made from recycled materials that we collected from home!

#### **Keystage 1—continued**

Year 2 have had a fantastic week, not only has it been sustainability week but we enjoyed a fab trip to Pendennis Castle and Castle Beach as well! This week we have been 'Fume Fighters' and have been looking at alternative transport and how we can reduce air pollution. The children have really enjoyed learning about alternative energy sources and using their knowledge to design their own environmentally friendly vehicle.

On Tuesday we learnt all about Pendennis Castle and the role it has played in protecting our coastline and enjoyed exploring the Gun Tower, Half Moon Battery and the Barracks. We then headed down to the beach for a spot of rock pooling and a refreshing ice lolly. We managed to catch a variety of crabs, fish and even a sea slug!

#### **Keystage Two**

Year 3 and 4 thoroughly enjoyed a rich week of cross-curricular learning during Sustainability Week. With a focus on clean water, pupils explored important themes across PSHE, art, English, geography, history, and science. They investigated the global issue of dirty water and its impact on living things, examined water pollution and improvements in sanitation and studied local rivers. The week concluded with pupils creating historical reports on the changes in the Red River. A truly insightful and purposeful learning experience for all!



**Unauthorised Exceptional Leave of Absence Information** 

The law requires parents to ensure their children receive an efficient full time education, and every minute of every day is important. Please help them not to miss any of the valuable time.

We hope that when you read the information outlined on our website, you will consider that your child's education is too important to take on

holidays during term time.

If an unauthorised leave of absence is taken, this may incur a penalty

notice being issued under Section 444A and 444B of the education Act 1996. This carries a fine of £60 if paid within 21 days or £120 if paid after this but within 28 days. Failure to pay the penalty notice will result in Court action.

#### **Unauthorised Late Information**

If your child is arriving late—after the register has closed at 8:50am it will be coded as a U which, is an unauthorised late mark. If your child accrues 10 unauthorised late marks within 100 sessions (10 weeks) you will be

committing an offence under the Education Act 1996.

The School may refer the matter to Cornwall Council who may decide to take legal action against you, issuing a penalty notice under section 444A and 444B of the Education Act 1996. This carries a fine of £60 per child, per parent if paid within 21 days or £120 if paid after this but within 28 days. Failure to pay the penalty notice will result in Court action.

Persistent absences/unauthorised lates, not authorised by the school, may result in a prosecution in the Magistrates Court, leading to fines up to £2500 and/or custodial sentences.
