Nursery

This week in Nursery, we have been busy exploring sorting and matching through lots of fun, hands-on activities! The children have been developing their observation and thinking skills by grouping objects according to colour and shape, finding the right padlocks and keys that fit together, and matching pairs of socks. These activities help build early mathematical and problem-solving skills, as well as encourage careful looking and attention to detail. The children have really enjoyed working together to find what belongs and what doesn't — a wonderful week of learning through play!

Reception:

This week in Reception we read the story Martha Maps it Out and used it to think about why we might make or use a map. We then visited our Redruth wall mural to spot places that the children recognised or had been to before. We used this as inspiration to create our own maps of Redruth that include places that are important to us. Some of the children thought it would be fun to make maps of some of our favourite stories, such as The Smeds and the Smoos.

Keystage One

This week in Year 1, we've had a wonderful time exploring labels, lists, and captions in English. The children are excited to put their new skills to use next week by creating their very own animal fact files! In Design and Technology, we thoroughly enjoyed designing and building shelters to keep a character dry, comfortable, and safe from harm. I'm sure you'll agree that the children demonstrated fantastic problem solving and creativity throughout the lesson. In History, we continued our journey through 'history within living memory', focusing on the evolution of travel and using time adverbials to explain our ideas clearly and confidently. Can you remember what mode of transport came first?

This week in Year 2, we have been learning about the seas that surround the UK. Can the children name the countries that make the Uk and the seas around us? We have also been learning about the origin of our food in DT. In writing we have been planning an extra chapter of The Gruffalo, from the point of view of a hedgehog eye witness! The children have also been learning 'The Harvest Samba' ready for our church visit on Monday. Thank you for all the parent volunteers that are making this possible. If you have any food donations please send them in with the children on Monday.

Lower Keystage Two

This week, Year 3 have completed their final ukulele lesson. Over the past six weeks, the children have learned to play a variety of songs and have thoroughly enjoyed the sessions. If you would like your child to continue with ukulele lessons in school, please speak to the class teacher for more information. In RE, we have been exploring the concept of 'The Fall' in Christianity, through the story of Adam and Eve. In our writing lessons, we have now completed our own build-up and climax sections of our adventure narratives, inspired by The Modern Boy! Everyone should be extremely proud of their hard work and creativity!

In Year 4 this week, we have been creative in both RE and DT. In RE, we have been looking at the Hindu festival of Diwali and had a go at creating our own rangoli designs. In DT, we concluded our Scrumdiddlyumptious learning by creating our own chapati breads and think they tasted pretty good! In maths, we have continued our learning of place value by working on using the column method for subtraction and in writing, we finished our persuasive speeches which made us really think about our impact on climate change.

Upper Keystage Two

This week, our Year 5 and 6 pupils continued reading their class novel, Northern Lights by Philip Pullman. The story is reaching an exciting point, and the children have been fully engaged—captivated by the twists and cliffhangers that keep them guessing. There's a real buzz in the classrooms as everyone is eager to find out what happens next!

In writing this week, the children have been developing their skills in explanation writing, linked to their science topic on the circulatory system. They have been learning how to write clear, concise paragraphs that explain complex ideas effectively. Pupils have also focused on using the semi-colon correctly, helping pupils to join related ideas and add variety to their sentence structures. It's been great to see the children applying their grammatical knowledge while explaining how blood circulates through the body — combining accuracy in writing with their growing scientific understanding.

In RE this week, Upper Key Stage Two continued their learning about Hinduism. Having already explored the ideas of Brahman, Atman and Karma, the children moved on to learn about the concept of Dharma. They discussed how Dharma relates to a person's duties, responsibilities and moral choices in life, and how it helps Hindus to live in balance and harmony. The children also reflected on their own duties and responsibilities, considering how these guide their actions and decisions in everyday life.




Art from Year 6!








Art from Year 6!

Unauthorised Exceptional Leave of Absence Information

The law requires parents to ensure their children receive an efficient full time education, and every minute of every day is important. Please help them not to miss any of the valuable time.

We hope that when you read the information outlined on our website, you will consider that your child's education is too important to take on

holidays during term time.

If an unauthorised leave of absence is taken, this may incur a penalty

notice being issued under Section 444A and 444B of the education Act 1996. This carries a fine of £60 if paid within 21 days or £120 if paid after this but within 28 days. Failure to pay the penalty notice will result in Court action.

Unauthorised Late Information

If your child is arriving late—after the register has closed at 8:50am it will be coded as a U which, is an unauthorised late mark. If your child accrues 10 unauthorised late marks within 100 sessions (10 weeks) you will be

committing an offence under the Education Act 1996.

The School may refer the matter to Cornwall Council who may decide to take legal action against you, issuing a penalty notice under section 444A and 444B of the Education Act 1996. This carries a fine of £60 per child, per parent if paid within 21 days or £120 if paid after this but within 28 days. Failure to pay the penalty notice will result in Court action.


Persistent absences/unauthorised lates, not authorised by the school, may result in a prosecution in the Magistrates Court, leading to fines up to £2500 and/or custodial sentences.






