Pennoweth News

Keystage One

Year 1 had a fantastic last week before this half term engaging in a range of exciting learning. They particularly loved our science experiments where we tested different materials to see which was the most absorbent. The children not only made great predictions but were able to write conclusions from the experiment as well. The children also learnt about family trees in History and loved talking about the people who were on their family trees with their class. Overall, we are very proud of all the children so far throughout their first half term. We hope you all have a well-earned break.

This week began with a special walk to St Andrews Church for our Harvest Festival. The children were fantastic and really enjoyed celebrating together. In Maths, we've been working hard on finding 10 more and 10 less than a number – a great way to build number confidence! As part of our project work, we've been learning how to read simple maps and use a key to understand symbols. The children have loved exploring and spotting features on different maps. In DT, we've been busy in the kitchen, learning how to choose the right tool for the job - from mixing to chopping, everyone had a go!

We hope you all have a wonderful week off, and we look forward to seeing everyone back on Tuesday.

Lower Keystage Two

Year 3 have had an exciting and action-packed week! We loved our trip to Kresen Kernow where we explored the archives and took part in a workshop examining prehistoric artefacts. Back in class, we finished reading Stig of the Dump and then enjoyed watching the film, comparing how it differed from the book. To round off our Tribal Tales project, we had great fun dressing up as characters from the Stone Age and getting creative with art activities, especially painting on pebbles and making our own cave paintings!

In Year 4 this week, we've rounded up a great term of learning with some art to celebrate the festival of Diwali, singing and playing instruments to ABBA hits and creating our own plate of healthy food in DT. In maths, we concluded our learning of addition and subtraction with some lessons on the inverse operation and checking strategies. We've also had a go at writing a POV paragraph in writing, writing from the perspective of the main character in our novel, Alfie. Have a look for some of these in the newsletter!

Upper Keystage Two

On Monday, Year 5 and Year 6 explored the Hindu celebration of Diwali during a KS2 assembly led by Mrs Augarde, as well as in their weekly RE lesson. Diwali, known as the Festival of Light, is a time of joy and celebration for Hindus. Children were offered the opportunity to engage creatively by choosing to make a Diwali card, craft a diya lamp or color in rangoli patterns.

Bloodheart Project Finale

Year 5 and 6 brought their Bloodheart science project to an exciting close this week with a heart dissection demonstration. Following strict health and safety guidelines, children were challenged to identify key external features, including the major blood vessels such as the aorta and vena cava. Carefully, Miss Crane then sliced open the heart to reveal its internal structures - the atria, ventricles and valves - helping pupils see first-hand how this incredible organ works. The experience was both fascinating and memorable, bringing their learning about the human circulatory system vividly to life!

In addition, children had a fantastic time during DT Day exploring the theme of healthy eating. They began by learning about nutritious foods and looking at different recipes for inspiration. Then, putting their ideas into action, they worked together to create their own delicious pasta sauces and baked wholesome wholewheat bread. It was a fun, hands-on day that combined creativity, teamwork and healthy cooking!

Upper Key Stage Two had a special visitor from Network Rail this week, who delivered an engaging and informative Railway Safety Talk.

Pupils learned the two most important safety rules:

Never go on the track

Always stand behind the yellow line on the platform

The session also included some fascinating railway facts! The children discovered that trains can reach speeds of up to 125 miles per hour, and that it takes the length of 20 football pitches for a train to stop when travelling at top speed. They were amazed to learn that one train can weigh the same as 80 elephants! The talk was both fun and eye-opening, helping pupils understand how to stay safe near the railway, while appreciating the incredible power of trains.




Art Club & Yr 6 Science Finale!





Unauthorised Exceptional Leave of Absence Information

The law requires parents to ensure their children receive an efficient full time education, and every minute of every day is important. Please help them not to miss any of the valuable time.

We hope that when you read the information outlined on our website, you will consider that your child's education is too important to take on

holidays during term time.

If an unauthorised leave of absence is taken, this may incur a penalty

notice being issued under Section 444A and 444B of the education Act 1996. This carries a fine of £60 if paid within 21 days or £120 if paid after this but within 28 days. Failure to pay the penalty notice will result in Court action.

Unauthorised Late Information

If your child is arriving late—after the register has closed at 8:50am it will be coded as a U which, is an unauthorised late mark. If your child accrues 10 unauthorised late marks within 100 sessions (10 weeks) you will be

committing an offence under the Education Act 1996.

The School may refer the matter to Cornwall Council who may decide to take legal action against you, issuing a penalty notice under section 444A and 444B of the Education Act 1996. This carries a fine of £60 per child, per parent if paid within 21 days or £120 if paid after this but within 28 days. Failure to pay the penalty notice will result in Court action.

Persistent absences/unauthorised lates, not authorised by the school, may result in a prosecution in the Magistrates Court, leading to fines up to £2500 and/or custodial sentences.


