'Positive Noticing Day' is all about the children sharing what they have noticed about each other and writing it on a label which the children take home. The children used words such as kind, thoughtful, funny, creative and beautiful. Why not try to build on this at home and let your children know all the great things that you notice them being or doing, perhaps using good manners, helping out with a job, being kind or making others smile. It will help to build their self esteem and hopefully encourage them to do it more! Staff like to use positive noticing—telling children when they are going over and above in terms of behaviour. Going forward perhaps your child will receive a little note from a member of staff saying what they have noticed about them or thanking them. In terms of behaviour management, I think it is really important to focus on all those children making great behaviour choices. I have high expectations for behaviour and insist on everyone behaving in a way that keeps everyone safe. and able to learn. Hopefully you have received my letter about a behaviour system that we are going to use in school to tackle repeated poor behaviour choices.

#### **Nursery Learning Highights**

This week we have been busy exploring a range of topics. As part of our Remembrance Day activities, the children created their own poppies and talked about why we wear them. The rainy weather has also given us wonderful opportunities to learn outdoors—filling and pouring water into containers, watching puddles grow, and of course enjoying plenty of puddle jumping! We have also been practising how to independently dress in our waterproof suits, helping the children build confidence and readiness for outdoor play. We also celebrated Children in Need with lots of spotty fun, taking part in themed activities and creating our own colourful, spotty artwork.





















#### **Reception Learning Highlights**

This week Reception have been finding out more about autumn and the changes that we see outside. We have talked all about animals that hibernate and how they prepare for the coming winter. The children were fantastic on our walk to Victoria Park and gathered lots of interesting natural materials. They didn't moan and groan on the walk and showed their amazing resilience and stamina. Well done Reception.

#### **Key Stage One Learning Highlights**

This week, Year I have loved diving into the story 'Is Your Mama a Llama?' in English. In art, the children have been busy creating portraits using collage techniques, and in history, we explored how entertainment in the 1950s compares to today, spotting both similarities and differences. This week, Year 2 have had an exciting time exploring the story We're Going on a Bear Hunt. The children have been busy creating their own imaginative settings and using onomatopoeia to describe the sounds they might hear along the way.

In science, we've been learning about the differences between things that are living, no longer living, and those that have never lived, sorting objects into these groups and discussing what makes them different.

We also enjoyed a visit from Brighter Smiles, who reminded us how important it is to keep our teeth healthy. The children learned some great tips for looking after their smiles!













#### **Lower Key Stage Two Learning Highlights**

This week in year 3, we were very excited to have a visit from Screech Owl Sanctuary as a part of our Predator project. We enjoyed meeting the different owls and finding out more about them. We also met a polecat called Stinky Pete!











#### **Upper Key Stage Two Learning Highights**

This week in UKS2, our Love to Investigate science session explored the question: How do animals stay warm? Pupils experimented with different insulators, using air and lard to see how they help to retain heat. They tested their ideas by putting on gloves and submerging their hands in icy water, comparing how long they could keep them in with and without insulation. It was a fun, hands-on way to discover how animals, like polar bears, survive freezing conditions.
