Our after school clubs started this week, which all the children who participated enjoyed. Table tennis club was particularly popular!




Nursery Learning Highlights

This week in nursery, the children have been exploring technology and how things work using the Indi cars. They investigated how different coloured mats affected the movement of the cars and worked together to plan routes to move them from A to B, developing their problem-solving, thinking, and communication skills. We also made the most of the windy weather by exploring kites and windsocks outdoors, observing how the wind makes them move and talking about our ideas and discoveries.



Reception Learning Highlights

This week in Reception we have been reading the story Dear Dinosaur and thinking about how we can write letters to other people. The children have enjoyed making their own letters and notes to their friends and asking questions to their favourite dinosaur. In maths we have enjoyed talking about mass and have used balancing scales to investigate this.



Key Stage One Learning Highlights

This week Year 1 have been writing their own traditional tale in the style of The Ugly Duckling. We have been so impressed with their use of language and careful handwriting! In science, we have been exploring how animals have adapted over time to new environments and in art we have been practicing our mark making skills!






In geography, we have been using the 4 cardinal compass points to give the location of cities in the UK.



Lower Key Stage Two Learning Highlights

This week in Year 3, we have been super scientists investigating rocks, focusing on the question: What is sand? We examined different samples of rocks and sand closely, made careful observations and used scientific skills to compare, describe, and ask questions, just like real scientists. Well done, Year 3, for being such curious and enthusiastic scientists! 🌟

Year 4 have spent this week looking at traditional tales and written the beginning of some beautiful adaptations of Goldilocks and the three bears. In maths, we have been looking at short multiplication and division and in science we created posters in order to educate people on what plants need to live and grow.

The children are continuing to enjoy their mealworm investigation, which included cleaning out their mealworm habitats this week!


