Reception Learning

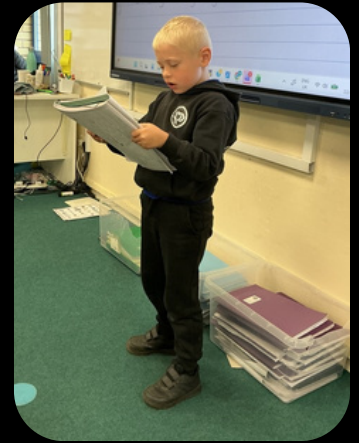
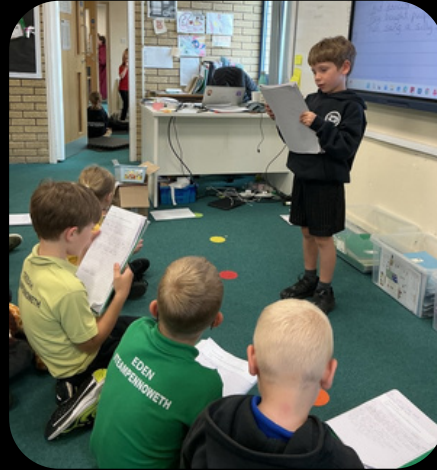
This week in Reception we have been learning about rockpool habitats. We looked at the story 'Sharing a Shell' and talked about creatures that we might find in a rock pool, and about how we can resolve any squabbles that might occur with our friends. The children created amazing rockpool paper plates and lots of other artistic creations.



Key Stage One Learning Highlights

In Year 1 this week we have worked incredibly hard, especially as we completed the Phonics Screening Check. Well done to everyone for their fantastic effort! To celebrate, we enjoyed a small treat from Mrs Thomas. In science, we have been learning about the structure of animals and exploring the different parts of their bodies. In English, we have been reading and discussing the poem "What is Pink?", thinking carefully about the images and ideas it creates. It's been a busy and enjoyable week of learning!

In English, Year 2 thoroughly enjoyed learning and performing The Owl and the Pussycat. The children explored the poem's rhythm, rhyme and imaginative language before using it as inspiration for their own writing. They created some fantastic nonsense poems, full of creativity, humour and wonderful ideas. In History, we learned about Henry VIII and his six wives. The children enjoyed discovering fascinating facts about the Tudor period and learning why Henry VIII remains such an important figure in British history. We also learned about St Piran and the story of how he became the Patron Saint of Cornwall.

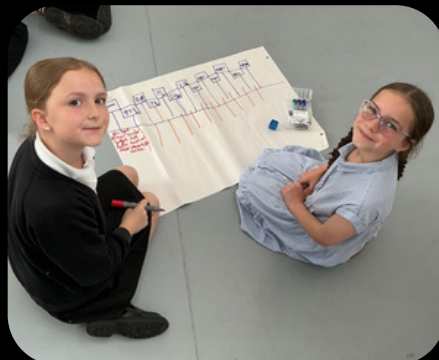


Lower Key Stage Two Learning Highlights

Year 3 launched their exciting new project, "Mighty Metals." As scientists, we have been exploring different types of forces, including contact and non-contact forces such as gravity and magnetism. To bring their learning to life, we held a special 'DT WOW Morning' on Friday, where they investigated a range of mechanisms and discovered how they work, showing great curiosity and enthusiasm throughout.

In Year 4 this week, we have really enjoyed looking at and innovating 'El Dorado', a poem by Edgar Allan Poe. As writers, the children have created new characters and settings, used rhyming patterns and performed their poems, taking huge pride in their work. We also started our new project 'I Am Warrior!' this week, which focuses on the Romans. We have plotted significant dates and events on a timeline, working across the year group, and annotating this with key facts and information.

The children have also made us immensely proud not only this week, but with how hard they have been working for weeks towards their multiplication tables check (MTC). All children in Year 4 have to sit a statutory test to determine whether they can recall their times tables fluently up to 12, through a set of 25 timed questions and this has taken place this week. As always, our children have blown us away with their hard work, perseverance and determination to consistently better themselves and their scores absolutely reflect this. A huge well done to everyone in Year 4, you are awesome!



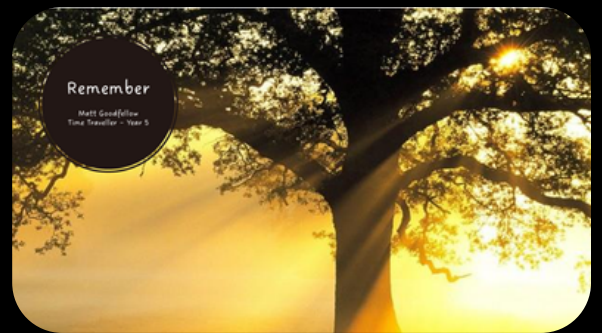
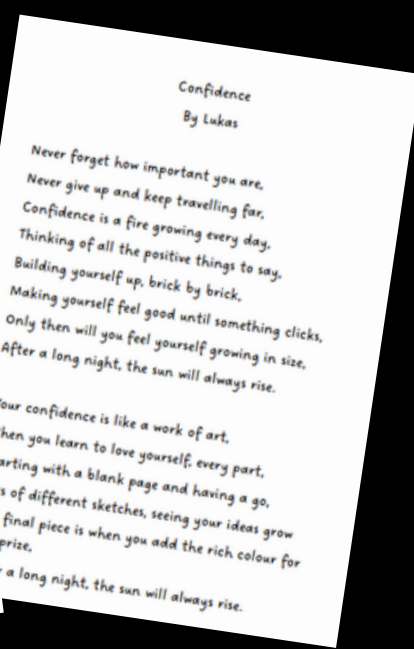
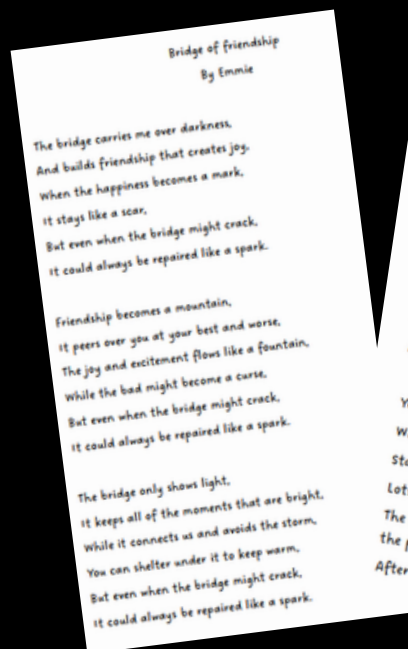
Upper Key Stage Two Learning Highlights

This week, Year 5 & 6 began their new topic, Time Traveller, and are now in the second week of reading 'The Nowhere Emporium' by Ross Mackenzie. The story moves between the 1800s and the present day, allowing children to explore different time periods while following the novel's mysterious and magical adventures. This will link in well to next week's writing genre, where pupils will begin exploring the features of a dystopian narrative.

As part of their poetry unit, Years 5 and 6 explored Remember by Matt Goodfellow, a moving poem that conveys a message of hope through powerful imagery and thoughtful metaphors. Inspired by the poet's style and themes, the children went on to create their own original poems, reflecting on ideas such as friendship, confidence, resilience and overcoming challenges. Their writing showcased impressive creativity, emotional depth and careful use of language. Take a look at a couple of wonderful examples from Poldark Class.

As artists, pupils developed their observational drawing skills through a series of portrait studies. Using mirrors to create self-portraits, pupils began by producing quick sketches of individual facial features, such as eyes, nose and mouth, before progressing to drawing the whole face. They explored the importance of proportion and placement, as well as how different pencil pressures can be used to create a range of tones. Pupils also practised shading techniques to add depth and detail to their work, building confidence and skill in preparation for their final portrait pieces.
